## What to Expect Supports Coordinator Employment Process

Your Supports Coordinator (SC) will:

- Talk about employment during any meeting that involves you.
- Inform you about the options available to you.
- Connect you to options and services that will help you meet your goals.
- Refer you to the Pennsylvania Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) and follow up on your behalf.
  - Once OVR has reached its decision regarding your eligibility, your SC will ensure that you are offered a selection of employment providers so that you can choose the one that's best for you.
- Assure that all necessary paperwork (such as the Service Preference Packet and Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services) is up to date.
- Make sure the Individual Support Plan (ISP) is clear to you and reflects your personal goals.
- Assure that employment goals are clearly listed under the employment section.
- Assist with transportation options, including but not limited to family support, SEPTA, Rideshare (Uber/Lyft), and applying to Customized Community Transportation (CCT)...
- Work with employment providers to ensure progress is being made.
- Ensure that all services are working together to support your employment.
- Refer you to a Benefits Counselor who can explain Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) changes that might happen while you're working.
- Check-in with you about your job and discuss future goals.
- Help you to understand what services will be available to you when you graduate from high school.
